Family, faith and friends are important to me.

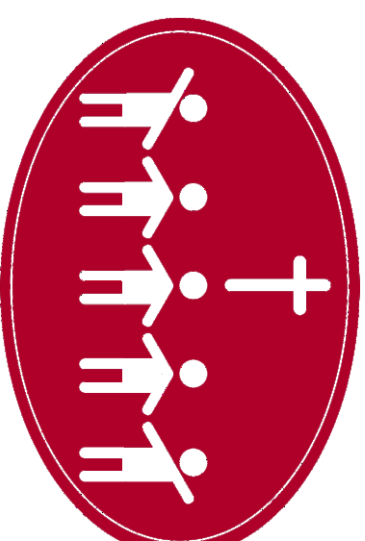

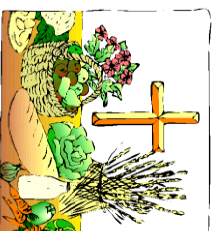

PARISH FINANCES

The Parish enters a new era as we welcome our new Incumbent and look forward to a more settled and dynamic period. We have emerged from the vacancy on an even keel financially, however the opportunities for growth, which come with Rev Jeremy's appointment, also bring additional costs and I would encourage Parishioners to keep supporting the Parish as we look to the future.

General Account (for day to day income and expenditure)

At the end of May this account had a *surplus* of £17,996. This is very healthy but includes the entire year's Gift Aid of £12,330, which has to be spread over the whole tax year. We need other income, of £5,000 per month, to continue to run the Parish, which is a big commitment for us all.

Fabric Account (for upkeep and repair of property and buildings)

At the end of May this account also showed a *surplus* of £8,103, although monthly fabric fund giving still remains well below 2017 levels. We are awaiting a large bill for the redecoration of the Parish Hall, a much needed project, which will benefit the whole community. In addition we will again be looking at major works at St John's, which have been on hold during the vacancy. Please contact either myself or Isobel McCollam if you wish to set up a bankers order for this fund.

Music in the Parish

I write this after a momentous and thrilling few days in the parish: the Institution of our new rector on Ascension Day, followed by his first service in both churches.

From the music point of view, the Institution on Thursday 30 May was a 'first' for several reasons: the first time to have had a combined choir of singers from St Patrick's and St John's; the first time to have delivered a psalm unaccompanied, and the first time to have had a group of young musicians lead two of the hymns at such an important service.

For me these were all reasons to celebrate, especially as each of them is a platform for 'more of the same'.
