Vicar's Annual Report 2016

I begin my Vicar's report somewhat aware of the fact that I had hoped by this stage to actually be the Vicar; however as most of you know, the requirements for transfer from Non-Stipendiary Ministry to full time ministry have changed and I find myself in a third year as your curate.

However that has not been an entirely unfortuitous turn of events. This has been a year that has had some difficult moments, and some of the deeper issues and needs facing the parish have become clear. We are a parish with skills, talents and resources. There is undoubtedly enthusiasm within the church and for the church. But we are small, we have big gaps in the age profile of our congregation, this part of Co Antrim is a hard place for newlyweds to buy a home, our younger adults are living in an increasingly demanding work environment, our older adults are, well, getting older - and as one said to me, "Old age ain't no place for sissies". I think Bette Davis had said it first but the truth is there, getting older is as strenuous as any fulltime commitment. And so trying to get people do 'church stuff' on top of everything else is extremely challenging - especially as it is utterly undermining to the ministry of the church that when I visit someone and they tell me about the problems and pains in their lives that I then have to ask them to do x, y or z in church as if I haven't even listened to a word they have said.

But, having said that, I know that many of you really do want to make this parish work, that you want to find ways to support people and not to burden them. There are as many solutions to these problems as there are people in this room, but what we need to make a real success of who and what we are is to have a shared vision, a way forward in which we identify what we can realistically do and then work together to deliver that vision.

That is that aim in putting together a group of a dozen people to work with the Diocesan Development Officer, Mr Trevor Douglas, to come up with a Parish Development Plan. The plan will identify what we want to achieve over the next five years, the areas where we need to invest time and energy, the people and the needs that we want to engage with, the opportunities we need to create for skills and talents to be expressed and so on. The plan will then be presented to the Parish, probably in the Autumn, for you to either accept or reject. For it to be a success the group that put the plan together must represent as best a cross section of the parish as possible; they should be your representatives and you should, by appointing them, support them and trust them to put together a plan that will work. The best and fairest way to make those appointments is if we make members of Select Vestry the core of the team. It's not a perfect solution, but Select Vestry are your elected representatives and whatever way the team is constructed, Select Vestry will need to be kept informed of the team's progress. So to that end I ask

that you appoint Select Vestry with an eye to our five year plan. It may be that we identify that certain age groups or interest areas are not represented in which case we would need to co-opt people onto the panel.

I'll come back to the Development Plan before I close, however one final comment at this point is worth making. I know that something similar was attempted before, and I know that it failed. That is not a good reason for us not to try again. That was then, this is now — it's time to move forward.

All of that said, we have much to be thankful for in terms of what we have achieved over the last year. Our production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat was, well, amazing and Mandy Brobyn in particular put in a huge amount of work to make it the success that it was. Our fundraising events continue to be a very significant source of income to the Parish as well as opportunities to be entertained and to be sociable together. Our Community Soup and Cheese lunches, and everything else that goes on in this hall week by week are the focus of our community engagement. The Wednesday evening Bible Study continues to be an enjoyable and stimulating gathering of, not 'Doubting Thomases' but of 'Thomases in search of Truth'.

But the very heart of what we do is our worship in church as we continue to champion Anglican worship and Anglican theology as a distinct and valuable engagement with God and with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I am, every Sunday, indebted to our Choir and to our two organists Pat and Sally for all the work that they put in and for the particular efforts that they put into the major festivals — Easter, Christmas and Harvest. And of course our Church Wardens Des, Bill, Chris and Colin who also put in a huge amount of time and energy to keeping our services on Sundays and on other occasions running smoothly. Subject to due democratic process, Des, Bill and Chris will get the chance for a bit of a rest as we appoint new wardens today — their stay in post has been longer than it should have been but I really appreciate their patience while we have sought to manage what is undoubtedly still a transition period for the Parish.

And in the same vein our Glebewardens Stephen and Michael and our Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer Ann and Norman all put in long hours to ensure that our parish functions as it should. And it is with a profound sense of appreciation for all that she has done in the past that I tell you that Ann is stepping down as Honorary Secretary. And also that, again subject to due democratic process, Michael is getting a chance to step down as Glebewarden.

And then there are our two Sacristans – Brian and Wilma; their work and care make my job so much easier and I appreciate that very much. In St John's Wilma is stepping down and Heather will be taking over from her and I know Heather will appreciate all Wilma's photographs and written instructions on how to do the job!

And finally on the stepping down list Daphne, Heather and Edward are not standing for Select Vestry this year.

I want to thank all nine of you for the work you have done over the years, I can't even begin to guess how to add up all the hours you have all put into your roles over the years — it is undoubtedly into the thousands. I know that I often take the work you do for granted, but my appreciation is sincere. Thank you.

There are of course a great many other roles that are carried out within the church – Isobel, Michael and Trevor support Norman with the finances. More people than I can count work with Anne, Alison, Isobel, Noreen and Margaret to run the Soup and Cheese Lunches. Gail, Michelle and Catherine and all those who work with them, make our Sunday School, TeenBlast and the Organisations, points of engagement for the youngsters of the parish and beyond. The Ladies Fellowship guided by Elizabeth, Luella and Isobel has passed a significant birthday as it celebrated its 30th Anniversary with a dinner in the Templeton and I should also mention that the very enjoyable Percy French evening last Thursday raised £750. And then there are all those who are on the rotas for cleaning, flowers, reading and praying in church – All these give our worship and our witness a depth and a reverence which is widely valued and appreciated. And all the other roles and acts of service that happen and are barely remarked upon, yet our parish would be so much less without them, Thank you seems so little to express my genuine appreciation for all that you do.

Norman has mentioned the Standing Orders and the increased giving that is already coming in and is projected for the rest of the year – I want to say thank you for that. I do know that for some it felt like a rather too direct, blunt and perhaps even rude way to deal with what is meant to be Free Will Offering but for others it was actually something that they had been meaning to do and just hadn't got around to or didn't know how to get around to. The scheme has given us a stable income stream which has allowed us to appoint a paid parish administrator, and I'm delighted that Gail has taken up the post. The role, at the most basic level, is intended to get me away from my desk for 10 more hours each week. But I see it as delivering much more than just 'time for me to make better use of'. I know that as Gail gets to know and understand the ins and outs of parish

administration that she will do most of it far better, and far more efficiently than I can. I believe that she will be able to see and direct me into areas that need my attention that aren't getting it, and I believe that the role will be central to improving our parish communications and public profile.

Which I suppose leads me back to who we are and who we want to be as a Parish. And tied to that, what do you actually need in your minister (note that I said 'need' and not 'want'). We must be a church first and foremost. If our top priorities are not praying and reading the bible, we are, at best, a not terribly useful charity. And if your minister is not praying for you and is not reading his or her bible in such a way as to be able to teach you - then I suggest that he or she is at best a waste of your money. We identify ourselves as a people of faith, as Easter people who proclaim the Resurrection to Eternal Life, and that must be top of every priority list. But I also believe that that faith is based on the Grace of God which we have a responsibility to share. People come to us, often out of the blue, looking for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals: It is a fundamental principle of mine that I do not set preconditions for people who wish to have me offer prayers and a connection with God at those times in their lives. We must be an Open church - yes, that can be a difficult and even heart-breaking place to be, but for us who depend upon God's Grace ourselves - there can be no other place to be. And we must also apply that principle for those who come to church regularly and provide them with opportunities to serve God rather than to inflict duty and obligation on them. And indeed everything else that we do must be supportive of that principle. I hope, and pray, that the Parish Development Plan will echo that and form the basis of how we in real, practical, and relevant terms, make this a place that is open, attractive and spiritually nourishing to all.

I draw to a close with a word of thanks to the Archdeacon for chairing our Easter Vestry, I'll not tempt fate by saying that I hope we won't need you this time next year! But I particularly want to thank you for being at the other end of my phone when I need you – your wisdom and your experience are greatly appreciated.

Thank you to all of you, in part for coming out tonight, but mostly for your encouragement. I hear so many words of support and of appreciation of my ministry. You may never realise it but sometimes they have been just exactly the right words at exactly the right time, and all the rest of the time they confirm and strengthen my sense of calling to serve God in this place.

Finally my deepest thanks go to Nuala and my family. They say that behind every successful man there stands a woman. In my case there are four women. It is their love and support which assures me of God's love and it is in that strength that I share His love with you.

PARISH FINANCES

No 1 account (day to day income and expenditure)

At time of writing (3rd May), this account has a *surplus* of £10,200. This includes the recent receipt of £9,834 of Gift Aid Tax, without which this account would not cover day-to-day expenses. While monthly income during the summer months normally decreases, due to lower attendance, this should not happen this year, due to the significant number of Parishioners now contributing through standing orders (increased from 25 to 75 families) rather than envelopes.

No 2 Account (Fabric fund) - for upkeep and repair of property and buildings

This account has currently a *surplus* of £15,600. As the Fabric Fund now plays an essential role in supplementing the No 1 account, the Select Vestry would encourage Parishioners to continue to contribute to this account through monthly envelopes and to support planned forthcoming fund raising events.

The above accounts are linked, and hence debit interest is only incurred when the sum of the two accounts is negative.

What a joy and what satisfaction to know how much this service is appreciated by the local [and not so local] community. I would encourage any one who can spare a few hours to become involved, we have lots of fun and camaraderie whilst working together and job satisfaction is guaranteed!
