

GDPR

Welcome to the world of GDPR

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is a European Union "Regulation" which serves to protect the personal data of anyone in the EU and must be complied with.

The complete GDPR policy is 156 pages long and so we have produced a Parish Data Protection policy, which outlines the general GDPR principles relevant to our Parish policy.

The spirit of the GDPR focuses on protecting the individual. Our Parish Data Privacy Policy sets out the requirements that the Parish has to gather information for membership purposes.

It details how personal information will be gathered, stored and managed in line with data protection principles and the General Data Protection Regulation.

To ensure that we remain compliant it will be reviewed on an on-going basis by Select Vestry members.

Our Privacy Policy is given below, but both policies are available on our website at http://templepatrick.connor.anglican.org/gdpr/index.php

Parish Data Privacy Policy

1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

2. Who are we?

The **Parish of Templepatrick and Donegore**, (referred to hereafter as the **Parish**), is the data controller (contact details below in Section 9). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

3. How do we process your personal data?

The **Parish** complies with its obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To enable us to provide a voluntary service for the benefit of the public in a particular geographical area as specified in our constitution;
- To administer membership records;
- To fundraise and promote the interests of the church;
- To manage our employees and volunteers
- To maintain our own accounts and records (including the processing of gift aid applications);
- To inform you of news, events, activities and services running at the Parish;
- To share your contact details with the Diocesan office so they can keep you
 informed about news in the diocese and events, activities and services that will
 be occurring in the diocese and in which you may be interested.

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, events, activities and services and process your gift aid donations and keep you informed about parish and diocesan events
- Processing is necessary for carrying out obligations under employment, social security or social protection law, or a collective agreement
- Processing is carried out by a not-for-profit body with a political, philosophical, religious or trade union aim provided:

 *he processing relates only to members or former members for those with a political philosophical.
- the processing relates only to members or former members (or those who have regular contact with it in connection with those purposes); and
- there is no disclosure to a third party without consent

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with other members of the church in order to carry out a service to other church members or for purposes connected with the church. We will only share your data with third parties outside of the parish with your consent.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep data in accordance with the guidance issued by the Church of Ireland. https://www.ireland.anglican.org/cmsfiles/pdf/Resources/ParishResources/SelectVestry/GDPR/Retention_Guidelines_V1-0_Sept2018.pdf

or subsequent updates to this document.

Specifically, we retain electoral roll data while it is still current; gift aid declarations and associated paperwork for up to 6 years after the calendar year to which they relate; and parish registers (baptisms, marriages, funerals) permanently.

We will review this document on a regular basis but no less than every 12 months

7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which the Parish holds about you
- The right to request that the **Parish** corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for the Parish to retain such data
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability).
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable).
 [Only applies where processing is based on legitimate interests (or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority); direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics]
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office (UK).

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Privacy Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice. The new notice will explain the *new use* of your personal data prior to commencing the processing. It will set out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.

PARISH FINANCES

The financial year has now finished and the accounts are being prepared and analysed. Although our bank balance remains healthy, our expenses in the last 12 months have exceeded our income by £1,737.30. This is a smaller deficit than we suffered last year but is not sustainable in the long term, as we have had to eat into our cash reserves at a time when we would like to be investing in improved facilities at Donegore.

General Account (for day to day income and expenditure,

At the end of 2017 this account had a *surplus* of £7,170.44. As is often the case in a vacancy, the last quarter has seen a small reduction in income and I would encourage Parishioners to keep supporting the United Parish as we look to the future.

Fabric Account (for upkeep and repair of property and buildings)

At the end of the year this account also showed a *surplus* of £5,102.47. Monthly fabric fund giving has again slowed and our annual income from this source is less than three quarters of last year's. No new Bankers Orders, which have worked so successfully for the General Account, have been set up and we would again encourage Parishioners to do so. Please contact either myself or Isobel McCollum if you wish to set this up.

I look forward to presenting a fuller report at the Easter Vestry when the figures are finalised.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

FRIDAY 1 MARCH 2019

The World Day of Prayer (WDP), formerly known as the Women's World Day of Prayer, each year is put together by a different country. This year it has been written by the women of Slovenia, who are relatively new to the WDP Movement; this special service is titled 'Come - Everything is ready!

The first 2019 World Day of Prayer will begin as the sun rises over the island of Samosa and ending some 38 hours later back in the Pacific, as the sun sets over American Samoa. We will be praying and sharing with people in over 120 countries and islands around the world.

Background information on Slovenia

The following information is taken from the World Day of Prayer Order of Service.

Slovenia, part of former Yugoslavia, became independent in 1991. Its Capital is Ljubljana.

One of the smallest countries in Europe. Bordered by Italy, Austria, Croatia and Hungary.

The population of Slovenia is estimated as 2,000,000. About 50% live in towns, and 28% in the capital. The majority of population (82%) are Slovenes, but there are also Croats, Serbs, Bosnians, Macedonians, Montenegrins and a small number of Roma.

At the heart of this service is an open invitation for all to come to God's table; 'Come – Everything is ready! We hear the voices of some of those coming to the table: wives, mothers and grandmothers, Roma people, refugees and migrant workers. Their stories reflect the political and economic situation of Slovenia, from the time it was a socialist – communist state to the present day.

World Day of Prayer Service – Templepatrick and surrounding area

Within our own community of the Templepatrick area, this year the World Day of Prayer service will be held on Friday 1 March at 8.00pm in the Old Presbyterian Church, Templepatrick. There are seven participating churches, and everyone is welcome to join in this time of worship.

Thank you to the women of Slovenia for this service and pray that it might be both challenging and a blessing to all.

ONE OF MY FAVOURITE HYMNS

One of my favorite hymns is - How Great Thou Art.

A hymn of the power of God, the beauty of His Creation, the sacrifice of Jesus and knowing one day I am going to heaven. It's all about God, His works not mine. I love singing it when no one can hear me (especially on a windy day while I work) and with my church family, usually in St John's and occasionally in St Patrick's.

Written by Stuart K Hine (1899-1989) based on a 19th century Swedish poem 'O Store Gud' by Carl Boberg. There are a few different stories of how this came to be written. In the mid 1920's Carl Boberg was surprised to hear his poem at a meeting, being sung to a

It was translated into German and Russian before Stuart K Hine had heard it. The beauty and power of the hymn continues to bless believers today.

Swedish folk tune some years after it had been written.



O LORD my God! When I in awesome wonder Consider all the works Thy hand hath made; I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder, Thy pow'r throughout the universe displayed:
